Participants enrolled in training programs should be eligible to work in a manufacturing job upon completion of training.
5	Do you have a preference between part-time and full-time training modalities?	No - We do not require applicants to use a specific teaching modality. Applicants should design the strongest possible training program that meets the learning needs of their participants and has the greatest potential for a positive training outcome.
